PRINCIPAL'S Foreword



am pleased to present this School Annual Report for 2015 to our School Community. This document outlines our progression during the academic year and draws data from school and systemic sources including NAPLAN.

We at Lighthouse Christian School are proud of our past achievements, our progression toward identified goals, and our daily commitment to seeing every child in every classroom improving and achieving. Our dedicated, talented and caring staff are passionate about providing the very best teaching and learning programs and opportunities for students.

In 2015, Lighthouse continued its commitment to providing evidenced based teaching and learning throughout the school. Our work with the Big Write program, introduced the previous year to enhance student writing development and outcomes, continued to be refined. We saw the fruit of these endeavours in improved student results in systemic and internal testing. In Semester Two, the development of our 2016-20 Strategic Plan was informed by the Australian Council of Education Research's (ACER) National School Improvement Tool.

School Leadership and Teaching staff again demonstrated a strong commitment to building their capability by engaging in Independent Schools Queensland's (ISQ) Self Improving Schools (SIS) Program. This flagship agenda supports schools to develop and implement evidence-based strategies for continuous improvement.

Lighthouse has continued to provide an affordable and therefore accessible Christian schooling option for families. Small classes provide individualised teaching and learning, enabling a strong focus on the development of literacy and numeracy skills. Fundamental to our commitment to ensuring the spiritual development of each of our students is ensuring our curriculum is framed by a biblical world view and encourages students to learn to find their purpose in following Jesus' example.

During Semester Two, the school experienced a leadership transition period. The current Principal has served the school in the capacity of Principal for 13 years, and at the end of 2015, transitioned into a new role as School Pastoral Leader, with oversight of faith formation and targeted support for students. For the duration of Semester Two, a new Principal was appointed in the role of Principal-in-transition.

While the publishing of this report ensures both State and Commonwealth Government reporting requirements are met, it serves as a celebration of school year 2015 and the way in which we live out our motto of providing *Excellence in Christian Education* for every student, in every classroom, every day!

Lighthouse also attracts significant enrolments from families who, while not currently attending a Christian church, deliberately choose the school because they desire for their children an education that is based upon Christian beliefs and values.

Small classes provide the key to individualised teaching and learning, enabling a strong focus on the development of literacy and numeracy skills. Lighthouse has small class sizes at every stage of schooling, enabling students to receive regular feedback and attention, thereby maximising the opportunities for student improvement and achievement. This personalised environment has added benefits for student wellbeing, engagement in learning, positive relationships with teachers and peers, and the satisfaction of accomplishment.

SOCIAL CLIMATE

Lighthouse Christian School has three core values which underpin the Social Climate and Learning Environment for students: Respect for God; Respect for Others; Respect for Self. Students are encouraged and rewarded for adherence to these values throughout the course of the year.

Lighthouse is committed to Christian education that instills a sense of hope, faith and Godly wisdom into the lives of students. This is supported through weekly Bible lessons, chapel and praise and worship services, and scripture memorization and study. Lighthouse has a strong reputation in the broader community for catering for student diversity including support for students at educational risk. A proactive and passionate Social Justice Team which includes school based staff, School Chaplain and school representatives coordinate appropriate intervention and support as required.

Students are taught to "Do the Five" in response to bullying behavior. This is further supported by our school's Anti-Bullying Charter.

In 2015, Lighthouse Christian School enjoyed its highest Prep intake for several years. The school continues to draw its enrolment from the founding Church community (Lighthouse Baptist Church) and has attracted a high proportion of families from other Christian Church fellowships and parents desiring a school committed to promoting biblical values. The retention of school staff from 2014 was near 100% with some staff increasing their employment fraction.

Student involvement in extra-curriculum programs continued to increase.
