



Dear LCS Family,

n January, we welcomed more than one hundred and eighty five new and returning students from Prep to Year 12, our highest January enrolment. Fifty-one students have joined Lighthouse for the very first time! Our team at LCS are grateful to God for this opportunity to serve families in pursuit of the Lighthouse Christian School Mission, that is:

To educate and train up a child in the principles of godly living in an atmosphere that glorifies our Lord Jesus Christ, utilising a quality curriculum, teaching the National / Queensland syllabus and integrating Christian principles and a biblical world view.

You may be aware that in December, our **School Dux**, Hannah Buchholz, attained the second highest OP result for any student who has graduated from LCS in recent years. This result is just reward for Hannah's diligence

during her schooling journey and the expertise of our Senior School staff. This month, she commenced a Bachelor of Nursing degree at CQU.

In January, Miss Kiara Yasso-McLeod was appointed to the position of full time Teaching Assistant (Prep) for the 2017 Academic year. Kiara graduated from LCS in 2015. In 2016, she worked with us in a volunteer capacity and commenced a Teacher Aide qualification through TAFE. In addition, she has been active for many years in Children's Ministry and Missions work in her church fellowship.

Last year, our school improvement agenda saw LCS staff focus on developing excellence in Effective Pedagogical (Teaching) Practice, specifically Explicit Instruction and Feedback. Our school systems for teacher coaching and development have seen these evidence based strategies embedded in classrooms from Prep to Year 12.

In 2017, our school improvement priorities are for LCS Staff to:

- Embed the Essential Skills for Classroom Management;
- Implement a revised Whole School Assessment and Benchmarking Schedule.

Our progress toward these outcomes is already well underway. Our Student Free Days (January / April), our weekly staff meetings and our **Coaching and Mentoring Programs** ensure we, as a team, are continuing to develop our teaching capabilities in order to provide an educational experience for our students that is best practice.

Following the successful pilot of the **evidenced based Phonics Program**, Write2Read2Spell, in our Early Years Classrooms, we have now expanded this to be part of the daily routines in all primary classes (P-6).

Also this year, the model for our **Senior Secondary** Department has

transitioned with LCS having adopted examples of best practice from some of the highest performing schools in Queensland and indeed Australia. We are very pleased with progress made thus far and all of our students from years ten, eleven and twelve are engaging positively with these reforms.

Our Senior (Y10-12) cohort are applying themselves with great diligence to their selected subject areas and in **preparation for Core Skills Testing** which will occur (for our year 12s) later in the year.

We trust you enjoy reading this edition of the Lantern which informs and celebrates the highlights of Term One at LCS! We thank God for His hand upon us in our journey.

Looking forward to seeing you in and around our school throughout the year.

he LCS team continues to prioritise the capability development of every staff member. During January's Student Free Days, teachers and teacher aides worked with Jill McPherson, Educational Consultant with EdStrategic, on the Essential Skills for Classroom Management program, devised from the research of Christine Richmond.

Essential Skills for Classroom Management enables educators to foster a calm and supportive classroom through effective management. It covers topics such as: setting clear expectations, acknowledging appropriate behaviour, timely correction of inappropriate behaviour and exploring the 10 essential skills in practice.

Jill comes to us with over thirty years of educational experience in Independent Schooling including her previous role as Director of Innovation, Teaching and Learning at Trinity Anglican School in Cairns.

Jill will continue to support our integration of this program into daily classroom practice over the next two years. ■

to firstly focus our attention on God before anything else forms a great foundation for the rest of the week.





TELL US ABOUT ONE MOMENT THAT STANDS OUT AS GOD **WORKING IN YOUR LIFE.**


It wasn't one specific moment, but it was different events God put in our path to guide us, as a family, to Rockhampton!
