FROM THE PRINCIPAL

ear LCS Family, We were overjoyed to commence the academic year here at Lighthouse with a considerable number of new staff and students. Again, this year our school enrolment has continued to increase. To cater for this additional student growth, and to maintain a strong level of support, we have engaged eight new full and part time staff. Each have further strengthened our team with their heart, skill and commitment. Our sixty staff members are grateful to God for this opportunity to serve families in pursuit of the Lighthouse Christian School Mission, that is:

To educate and train up a child in the principles of Godly living in an atmosphere

that glorifies our Lord Jesus Christ, utilising a high quality and systematic curriculum, and integrates Christian principles and a biblical world view.

Our current growth trajectory and our vision to become a double-streamed P-12 Christian School of intentional excellence by 2025, has required us to re-consider our school's organisational structure going forward.

As a result, the school and the school board chair made the decision to create a new Head of Primary position from the commencement of the 2021 Academic Year. Our Curriculum and Learning Coordinator (P-6), Jasmin Smyth, has been appointed to this role. Jasmin first joined the Lighthouse team in 1994, the very first year of the school's operation, as a Y2-3-4 teacher. Since then, she has served as a teacher in years 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7, as Literacy Coach, and more recently a Year 1 teacher and Curriculum Coordinator. All four of her children are or have been Lighthouse attendees.

As part of the school's leadership team, Mrs Smyth's focus is on the systematic delivery of curriculum, the implementation of effective pedagogical practices, the development of an expert teaching team and the analysis of student performance data to identify and action the most important next steps for student learning in the primary school. We congratulate Jasmin on this appointment.

Our building program continues to progress. Shortly, our Prep Precinct will commence in readiness for the 2022 school year. An additional outdoor covered teaching space has also been designed with construction expected to commence within twelve months. Our transport fleet continues to expand with

a new mini bus arriving within weeks.

Again in 2021, Lighthouse has developed an intentional and articulate School Improvement Agenda that focuses on LCS school staff developing excellence in Effective Pedagogical (Teaching) Practice. Our school systems for teacher coaching and development continue to ensure a range of high yield, effective, evidence-based strategies are embedded across all Prep to Year 12 classrooms every day.

In 2021, our School Improvement priorities include:

Priority One: Excellence in Teaching Practice:

- Explicit Instruction as the signature pedagogy.
- Feedback for Students: written and verbal.

Priority Two: Intentional Instructional Leadership

- School-wide data collection and analysis.
- Whole school curriculum planning.
- Staff performance development planning.

Priority Three: Inclusivity by Design and Intent:

- resilience program
- student leadership program.

Our work across these areas is rigorous. Student free days, weekly staff meetings and our coaching and mentoring programs ensure we as a staff are continuing to develop our teaching capabilities





PRIMARY TO SECONDARY A SMOOTH TRANSITION...

ne of the things you should notice when you enter just about any classroom on our campus are the data walls, particularly the mapping of student progression data for literacy and numeracy. As a school, one of our strategic goals is to ensure that all students are improving and the tool we use to measure this is by gathering continual data from NAPLAN style testing.


In recent years, Lighthouse has been identified as the most improved school in Rockhampton after the NAPLAN results were collected and analysed, and this is in no small part due to our focus on data to make informed decisions on the next most important learning goal for your child. This analysis of NAPLAN results on a national scale has identified a concerning trend across Australia that has been widely reported in media outlets, and that is the decline in student improvement between year 5 and year 7. Many attribute this plateauing of results to the fact that Year 7 is now the first year of secondary schooling and their results are impacted by the challenges that come with high school, including moving from a sheltered environment of one classroom and teacher, to multiple classrooms, multiple classes and multiple teachers.

We want to solve this problem in our context and instead support students in their learning journey as they transition from Primary School through to being confident Senior Secondary students. We have designed a pathway to which we are referring to as a gradual increase in autonomy to give students the opportunity to develop their confidence and study habits.

Our Year 7 students, while being assigned lockers like all other secondary students, are kept in a highly structured and supported environment. Over the last two years, both classes of year 7 students at Lighthouse have remained in the Eagle Centre for most of their classes and have had only two main teachers for all learning areas in the year 7 precinct. This model, which does not differ that much from a traditional year 6 learning environment, provides a gentle introduction to students where they can develop self-confidence in a safe environment and don't get "lost".

This year we have also ensured that the Year 8 students have their own classrooms and centre that they can learn in without moving around the school. The Samuel Centre is where you will find both year 8 classes for all of their lessons except Science. However, to prepare them for senior and ensuring that they familiarise themselves with subject specific teachers, students have multiple teachers who come to the Year 8 precinct to teach them. Adjusting to having multiple teachers and teaching styles can be overwhelming for students and is a skill we want all students to master without being distracted by multiple learning environments and movement.

Year 9 is the last year of Junior Secondary schooling – the last year to prepare for Senior Secondary. With this in mind, it's also the first year that our Junior Secondary classes navigate



moving classrooms and having multiple teachers, and having multiple classes with the introduction of electives in year 9.

We will continue to collect data and adjust our program in the junior secondary sector as we progress over the years, but we are fairly confident that this design allows students to develop their approach to learning and study in a way that minimizes distraction in a supportive environment. By the time they commence year 10 they will have mastered the intricacies of secondary schooling confidently.

Example 2 Lighthouse Primary Biblical Education

s a Christian School, students provided opportunities are where they learn and know more about God through the Bible. Some ways they do this is through: Weekly Scripture memory verses, Wednesday morning and weekly Bible chapel classes. Throughout the term our students are given Bible scripture verses at the beginning of each week to memorize and recite. Our prayer is that each student can get a hold of God's truth and to hide God's Words in their heart as it says in Psalm 119:11 "Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee". We have seen that not only do students memorize and recite each verse but have also seen students show examples on how to show and live out these verses through their own lives. On Wednesday mornings, students gather in the Children's Centre for primary chapel. During chapel, students participate in worship where they get to sing songs

that tell all about God followed by a Bible lesson given by one of the pastors. During a chapel Bible lesson, students get to hear stories about God, lessons of different character traits and also how to apply their weekly verse in a practical way.

A big part of being in a Christian School is the opportunity to know and learn about God through our primary Bible lessons. This term for grades Prep to Grade 2, we have gone back to the beginning to look at God's goodness through His creation, why He made what He made and why He created us. It's allowed students to take a look at all the beauty of what God has done and to also understand that we have been put here on earth for a reason Timothy 4:12 vouthiss, 17 mothy 4:12 vourvouthiss, 17 mothy leive vour vouthis, 18 mothy leive vour vouthis, 18 mothy leive vour vouthis, 19 mothy leive vour vouthis, 10 mothy leive vouthis, 10 mothy leiv and purpose. For grades 3 to 6, we have been looking at the importance of God's Word including learning the names of the books of the Bible. We've looked at how God's Word is used to help us grow

and to understand God's amazing love for us. For any parents interested in their child learning more about God in a safe and fun environment, Lighthouse Kids is a ministry of Lighthouse Baptist Church for any child that is in the Primary grade. 


OUR FIRST EVER *Jear 6 Leaders*
