ANZAC COMMEMORATION

he ANZAC tradition - the ideals | of courage, endurance and mateship that are still relevant today - was established on 25 April, 1915 when the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps landed on the Gallipoli Peninsula. It was the start of a campaign that lasted eight months and resulted in some 25 000 Australian casualties. including 8 700 who were killed or died of wounds or disease. The men who served on the Gallipoli Peninsula created a legend, adding the word 'ANZAC' to our vocabulary, creating the idea of the ANZAC spirit and reminding us of the words found in John's Gospel, that Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends.


Flowers have traditionally been laid on

Laying a wreath of flowers is a way to show respect and an integral part of many commemorative ceremonies. In recognition and respect for those men and women who have served, wreaths were laid at our ANZAC Chapel by two students from each class and the Rockhampton Botanical Dawn service by our School Cpatains.





On Wednesday the 20th of April a year 10 team of excited and cheery students from Lighthouse Christian School attended the Science and Engineering challenge event hosted by Saint Ursula's College held in Yeppoon. Journeying there the common theme was a sense of unified curiosity fuelled by the anticipation of the unknown and the rumoured experiences from the schools' previous attendees.

Awaiting them at Saint Ursula's College were challenges designed to highlight both their intellect and character. Students were placed into groups of two to four members to attempt eight challenges. These ranged from bridge and turbine building, constructing earthquake resistant towers, rover construction, bionic hand construction, coding communication and city grid and transport planning. The activities of the STEM competition are created to stimulate and encourage the usage of skills which relate to possible Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics centred careers. The tasks students undertook not only required individual skill but incentivised strong teamwork. Students were able to develop their adaptability in terms of navigating co-operative behaviour under strict time demands. What was highlighted was

not only the ability to express individual ideas but to accommodate the ideas of others to achieve an equitable outcome.

Our students found most of their success within the turbine building challenge with two teams placing first. The students also performed splendidly during the bridge building competition with their creation placing them in a 3-way tie in first for weight load but third in standings for bridge mass. Overall, the school placed fifth out of the eight schools which attended. Though the day had demanded much from our students, true comradery was displayed during the final challenge with our students being found amongst the most enthusiastic of supporters for their teammate's creation. Beaming smiles were etched on our schools' attendees as the days' events concluded.


Evidence from such projects suggest that STEM knowledge, understanding and skills seem to be strengthened when connections between learning areas are emphasised. The Science and Engineering challenge highlights to students their ability to explore scientific principles rather than being guided to a predetermined answer.

Bullying 2022, the Year 9 to 12

Film and Media students, with the help of Mr McLeod, created a video to demonstrate the harmful effects of bullying. While at times confronting, the promo wasn't without a positive message, showing that unity amongst students and greater peer support for victims of bullying could play a big role in helping reduce the severity of bullying in schools.

The idea was born out of a list of words compiled by the Film & TV classes, describing the feelings associated with and the consequences that stem from bullying. This list was then converted into a script, to be read as a narration over scenes designed by the students to depict different types of bullying, including verbal, physical and cyber.

Although the project was carried out with an air of thoughtfulness, given the serious nature of the content, there was still plenty of laughter and positive student engagement during the filming of the video. One of the ways, for example, that students who portrayed bullies were able to convincingly play their roles without upsetting or offending, was by yelling words of encouragement at their victims instead of insults. As the sound wasn't required for the final video, this gave the impression of mean and hurtful speech, when in actual fact it was an exercise in positive reinforcement and would generally have kids laughing uncontrollably at the end of each take.

Producing this video has definitely had a positive impact on the students involved, not only in the production experience they gained, but also in the ways they were

able to extend themselves creatively on a project they were all emotionally connected to in some way. Keep an eye out for next year's anti-bullying video, given the talent and artistry on display in this year's production, 2023 promises to be just as epic.




During Term 1, each student had the opportunity to video conference with Tony for a 45 minute session to unpack their
