Dear LCS Family,

We were delighted to again welcome several new staff and new families to Lighthouse in 2023!

The opening of the Lighthouse Kindy has been among many highlights we've enjoyed thus far this year. The renovations to the Genesis Centre have been truly remarkable and we commend all involved.

To cater for the continued strong interest in our community and to maintain an

excellent level of student support, we have engaged additional full and part time staff, each further strengthening our team with their heart, skill, and commitment. Our team of ninety are grateful to God for the opportunity to serve families in pursuit of the Lighthouse Christian School Mission, that is:

To educate and train up a child in the principles of godly living in an atmosphere that glorifies our Lord Jesus Christ, utilising a high quality and systematic curriculum, and integrating Christian principles and a biblical world view.

Our current growth trajectory and our vision to become a double streamed K-12 Christian School of intentional excellence by 2025 has required us to reconsider many of our school's structures going forward. Renovations over the 2022-23 Christmas period have included the reconfiguration of our Student and General Reception areas, and a conversion of the Bethel Centre into two (Year 2) classrooms. There have been delays to building works across Queensland and this has impacted our start time for the building of our new undercover area, however the tendering process for this work has now commenced and we are hopeful to have this impressive structure completed in time for the start of 2024.

Again in 2023, Lighthouse has developed an intentional and articulate School Improvement Agenda that focuses on

LCS school staff developing excellence in Effective Pedagogical (Teaching) Practice. Our priorities continue to ensure teaching for learning remains front and centre. In recent years, we have worked hard to embed school-wide systems for teacher coaching and development and have continued to ensure a range of high yield, effective, evidence-based strategies are applied across all Kindy to Year 12 classrooms daily. We have intentional practices to support the wellbeing of all students well established.

Our theme this year is "Moving the Middle"; an intentional focus of teacher and school practices that will see student academic outcomes lift further, ideally Cs to Bs, Bs to As and beyond. Our Explicit Improvement Agenda and Implementation Priorities are listed below.

TECH CLUB

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Digital literacy is a term we will hear in education circles for many years. Technology is taking over the world, and students must prepare for a digital world. Robotics, computer programming and gamification are just a few things that students will engage in at Tech Club. Tech Club has been popular this year, and students have been engaging well with technology. The high school students have been working through the GROK learning modules and competitions therefore improving their coding and computational skills. Other students have been working on extension projects from their technology classes. These projects include SwiftUI app development, HTML, CSS, and JavaScript. The primary school students have been learning some SwiftUI on Swift Playgrounds. This learning consists of the Learning to Code and Getting Started with Code modules.

This year, students will learn how to code Spike Prime robots, prepare for a robotics competition, and learn some essential coding concepts. Students will use Code Club Australia, Code.org, and GROK Academy resources. These resources contain a range of activities from simple blocked-based coding to simple text-based coding activities.

In 2022, we commenced an academic extension trial with our Year 3 and Year 5 students who identified as achieving within the Upper 2 Bands of their NAPLAN testing. As part of the trial, we provided practical opportunities for these students to be challenged in the areas of Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths. We are very pleased to report that not only did students actively participate in these sessions, they thrived.

With the goal of ensuring every student who walks through our doors reaches their maximum potential, this year we have an opportunity to be a part of gifted and talented testing which is being trialled by Cambridge University. The purpose of this testing is to help learners demonstrate and fulfill their full potential. Students will be completing tests in Reading, Mathematical Reasoning, Thinking Skills and Writing components. All tests will be delivered electronically on school iPads.

All of the data collected will be used to inform testing instruments for gifted and talented students.

It is a great opportunity, and it is fantastic that our students are involved.


COMPASS LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE


