

PRINCIPAL'S FOREWORD



am pleased to present this Annual Report for 2022 to our School Community. It outlines our progression during the school year and draws data from school and systemic sources.

In January 1994, Lighthouse Christian School (Norman Park Christian School) staff commenced the school year in prayer and praise to God. Twenty-eight years later, around eighty staff commenced the school year again in praise, worship, and reflection upon the Lord's continued faithfulness for nearly three decades.

For the sixth consecutive year, term one commenced with significantly increased student numbers, this time eclipsing 400 for the very first time. In preparation for a double streamed K-12 campus by 2025, the school opened a modern and wellappointed purpose-built Prep Centre to house two classes. The previous Prep facility (Genesis Centre) was refurbished in readiness for the opening of Lighthouse Kindy at the start of 2023. Further, modifications to the Bethel Centre and the front of Student Administration occurred at the end of the 2022 Academic Year. The school has received significant government (BGA) funding to complete a million-dollar covered multipurpose outdoor facility in 2023, to be positioned near the Moore's Creek side of the property.

To meet the staffing demands of a growing campus,

the school has joined with other likeminded Christian schools to form a CQ Christian School Hub, with the purpose of innovatively future proofing regional schools with quality Christian teachers for the coming years.

In July, the school appointed Mrs Tracey Larson to the position of Head of Finance and Business (Business Manager) to lead the non-Teaching and Learning development of the school. Tracey had, since August 2021, worked as an advisor to the school in this area. She has been a significant addition to the school's leadership team.

Under the Chairmanship of Pastor John Buchholz, the school has again enjoyed the support of its School Board. New directors have been appointed and members have engaged in comprehensive training and development. Experienced board director and school leader, Ngaire Tagney, has continued in the capacity of External Advisor to the Board. We thank the board for their tireless endeavour.

School staff have continued with passion and intentionality, to progress our school's goals of Academics, Spiritual Growth, Social and Emotional Development and Physical Development. Some notable celebrations have included local success in robotics, interschool sports, and various cultural events. Curriculum offerings have broadened. At state level, we had a student attain a Queensland

NAIDOC Award in Writing, one of only 25 presented in the state. Nationally, the school's secondary band, Channel 56, defeated over 170 entries to be awarded Best Senior Band in Rockfest.

Continued strong interest from the community in quality Christian education will see our enrolment increase to beyond 450 students for the start of 2023. We will continue to progress toward double streaming across the school and expect this to be attained for the start of 2025.

We thank God for his continued grace and leading of our school community. We acknowledge the continued prayer and commitment of the school's parents and church membership into the lives of the next generation, and to seeing that every student at Lighthouse Christian School develops to see 1 Timothy 4:12 in action.

SOCIAL CLIMATE

Lighthouse Christian School continued to draw its enrolment from the founding Church community (Lighthouse Baptist Church) and attracted a high proportion of families from other Christian Church fellowships and parents desiring a school committed to promoting biblical values. The esteem of our school in the broader community is evidenced by continued strong enrolment growth.

The retention of school staff from the previous year was near 93% with some staff increasing their employment fraction.

DESCRIPTION OF HOW NON-ATTENDANCE IS MANAGED BY THE SCHOOL
